Letter from our Executive Director



Dear Friends and Community Partners:

It is my pleasure to present the 2010 Annual Report for Seattle Counseling Service. It was a busy year, with continued high demand for services especially in our mental health and addictions programs. We were humbled to serve 1716 people during the year, 800 of whom entered services for the first time, as they responded to the continued economic downturn with great courage and pride.

As government funding was, and continues to be cut in several directions and at all levels, SCS is even more grateful that King County designates 1/10% of tax revenue to support the MIDD (Mental Illness & Drug Dependency) strategies. This funding has proven absolutely essential to ensure that the complex system of support for mental health and substance abuse services was not dismantled during this unprecedented time of budget cuts.

Collaboration and innovation continued to be extremely important and effective strategies in 2010. SCS continued its partnerships with other community based agencies to ensure that services were not diminished and that funding was leveraged to its utmost potential. New programs were developed during this past year to respond to the needs of our community. These included tobacco cessation treatment for HIV + people and Women OUT, a program which provides direct services for women who use crystal methamphetamine.

Finally, it is only with the team of incredible Staff, committed Board Members, courageous Clients and supportive Friends & Community Partners that SCS is able to continue its essential work – to be a resource for our LGBT community that is responsive and compassionate during the most challenging times of our lives. Thank you for being a part of our “family” of support.
